A BASIC BLESSING IN HEBREW

Hebrew: Baruch Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech Ha'Olam, Sh'hecheyanu, V'Kiyemanu, V'Higianu LaZman HaZeh.

Pronunciation: bah-rooch ah-tah ah-doh-noye eh-loh-hay-noo meh-lehch hah-oh-lahm, sheh-cheh-hee-yah-noo veh-kee-yah-mah-noo veh-hee-gee-ah-noo lah-z-mahn hah-zeh.

Translation: Praised are You, the Eternal One our God, Ruler of the Cosmos, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and enabled us to reach this moment.

Kibbutz - A Kibbutz is historically a collective community based around the Utopian ideals of harmonious living. Farming is often essential to the success of a Kibbutz and you'll find them scattered throughout Israel's countryside.

Birthright - The Birthright program is a program set up for young Jews around the world to come to Israel. The birthright association offers a 10-day all-expenses paid trip around Israel for young Jewish adults. Thousands of Birthright tourists arrive every year

Tel - An artificial hill created by many generations of people living and rebuilding on the same spot. Over time, the level rises, forming a mound. Excavating a tel can reveal buried structures, religious shrines and homes, located at different depths depending on their date of use.
